On Friday evening, following a rewarding day of lectures, the participants will be treated to a unique musical feast — Accordion Furioso, performed by Motion Trio featuring the Aukso Chamber Orchestra.

The renowned Polish accordion group known as Motion Trio was established by Janusz Wojtarowicz, a creator of the "accordion trio" idea, which is becoming a popular and entertaining form of musical expression. Janusz Wojtarowicz, the author of most compositions performed by Motion Trio, along with Paweł Baranek, and Marcin Gałażyn are world class accordionists using all advantages and sound possibilities of the accordion in their creative work.

This is how AUKSO was born; the name, chosen by the ensemble — a Greek word meaning growth / to grow — is not accidental; expressing the musicians aspirations, it is also marking the direction of their professional path. It's telling about the need for perfecting oneself and, as a consequence, about picking up the gauntlets and being receptive.

They have gained the respect of both critics and audiences, performing concerts in 36 countries all over the world, on all continents. They have given performances in some of most reputable concert halls in the world, including the Warsaw Opera House, New York's Carnegie Hall, the Konzerthaus in Vienna, London's Barbican Centre, and the Comédie-Française in Paris.

AUKSO Chamber Orchestra — In February 1998, one of Europe's most interesting chamber music ensembles came into being. A group of the graduates of the Music Academy in Katowice, Poland, together with Marek Moś, an outstanding violinist, conductor and chamber musician, created an orchestra, which was to be for them more than only a place of work — rather an area of artistic quest and creative development fostering the creation of art of the highest value.
